Sick Child/Exclusion for Illness Policy

To ensure we prevent the spread of infection among the child/children in our care, we ask parents to respect the “sick child exclusion for illness” policy, which is based according to guidance from the South West London Health Protection Agency.

This policy benefits children in three ways: firstly, by ensuring that the children get adequate care when ill, as parents you can offer the child most comfort when he or she is ill and make the best decisions about their care, including taking the child to the doctor/hospital if necessary. Secondly, this policy protects your child from infections when other children are ill. And thirdly, by protecting vulnerable children from infection that would rarely be serious in most children. These include those children being treated for leukaemia or other cancers, on high doses of steroids by mouth and with conditions, which seriously reduce immunity.

If your child arrives with any of the following symptoms below or develops them during the day, he or she will be excluded from our care until fully recovered.

- Diarrhoea and or/vomiting
- A temperature of 100 degrees or higher
- Unusual spots or rashes on the skin, which may or may not include itching, with a fever
- Sore throat with fever and swollen glands
- Headache or stiff neck, when accompanied by a temperature of 100 degrees
- Severe cough (child gets red or blue in the face and makes a high-pitched whoop after cough)
- Eye discharge (thick mucus or pus from the eye, or pink eye)
- Yellowish skin or eyes
- Child is irritable, continuously crying, or requires more attention than the nursery staff can provide without risking the health and safety of other children in our care.

Children may NOT come to the nursery if they are infectious or sick. If your child has been sick or had diarrhoea during the night, please do not bring them into their setting for 48 hours after the last time they vomited or had an episode of diarrhoea.

Parents/carers will be contacted to collect their child within the hour should the child become ill while at the nursery.

A sick child will be found a comfortable place to rest away from other children until the parent arrives and is reassured.

If possible, a member of staff will sit with the child, but otherwise the child will be monitored until the parent arrives.

COVID-19 – Please do not come attend any of the settings if you have any of the following:

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- 1) A high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- 2) A new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- 3) A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Now it is not a legal requirement to stay at home. If you do experience mild symptoms

- 1) Please get tested to be sure you do not have the virus. This way we can prevent the spread of the

In an Emergency –

The settings will call for an ambulance.

The parents will be informed by phone calmly explaining the situation that the child is on their way to hospital and they will be met there.

We will take the child's health record card with written parental consent for emergency treatment.

We will ensure ratios are maintained whilst the sick child is cared for

Parents are required to adhere to our sick child exclusion policy.

HIV/AIDS/Hepatitis (A, B and C) procedure –

The above viruses are spread through bodily fluids. Hygiene precautions for dealing with bodily fluids are the same for all children and adults. Disposable gloves and aprons will be used when changing nappies, pants and clothing that are soiled with blood, urine, faeces or vomit. Soiled clothing is rinsed and bagged for parents to collect. Spillages are cleaned using a mild disinfectant solution and any mops and cloths used will be disposed of with clinical waste. All furniture, toys and resources that have been infected will be cleaned with disinfectant.

Guidance: This policy is written in line with guidance from the document 'Managing Medicines in Schools and early Years Settings' –

All children's immunisation status will be checked at nursery entry.

Any immunisation that has been missed, please seek advice from the child's GP or Health Visitor.
